**Survey Tool - John Sweeney**

I think what we need to do as the SSMG is get inform back, so we have a long term plan on how we are to fund this. We need more information assembled. So when you attend a meeting you have more answers being asked.

**Discussion:** Sounds like there are a lot of VHS users. Can local radio equip work on this trunking? It looks like this is trying to collect is if the trunking were up and running today would the current radio systems work. There needs to be upgrades to radios to be part of the trunking.

Sounds like there is 3 kinds of equipment out there: can be VHF 25 capable, equipment that is VHF 25 capable, and equipment that can not be capable (old analog VHF radio, P25 800 radio) The survey tool might be getting at what category the radios in WI are in. Everyone would need subscriber programming.

**Dave Spenner-** Interoperability is a high propriety in the state of Wisconsin. Round 4 radios just completed. Round 5 will be coming soon. There are opportunities out there.

Does OJA or DOT have any of the information that is in the survey?

Most recent survey was done by WEM in 2003 (voluntary survey) 65 of the counties responded.

**Carl Guse-** ISSI question may be hard for most agencies to answer. Better question might be to ask if they are doing P25 standard, which should imply if they are on a certain network. Answers to what type of system are the counties utilizing, are known and fairly well documented. We have a map that captures that pretty well.

Would that map be available for our next meeting? Yes

**Jennifer Lord-Kouraichi-** That does bring up a valid point that we should look at the 2003 data, look at the questions presented and look at the response.

**Keith Tveit-** Concern that HS funding will continue to decrease. Continue to leverage GPR dollars.

**Jennifer Lord-Kouraichi** -Recommend that this survey be conducted online by EM Directors.

**Carl Guse** – remind the group that we are very close on having a contractor who will be responsible for a good amount of this work.
