INTEROPERABILITY COUNCIL CALL TO ORDER: 10:10

REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF PAST MEETING MINUTES

- MOTION
 - Motion made by Tom Czaja to approve April 9, 2009 meeting minutes
 - Motion seconded by Sue Riseling
 - Motion carries

INTRODUCTIONS - DAVID STEINGRABER

- FOCUS AND OUTREACH
 - Important to keep a regional and national focus when it comes to interoperability
 - Outreach and marketing are an important part of getting stakeholders to understand the Interoperability Council's standards-based approach
 - We need to get locals thinking interoperability when upgrading local systems / radios
 - We will never have the federal funding to foot all bills; we need to provide clear standards and be in the position to assist counties and communications regions in their steps to build interoperability
 - The strength that comes from an inclusive process (including all disciplines) is significant
 - The states that have the greatest success are the states that take everyone into consideration

- LEAGUE OF MUNICIPALITIES
 - Suggestion by Larry Nelson to bring outreach messages / marketing tools to the League of Municipalities and / or similar groups

OFFICE OF JUSTICE ASSISTANCE (OJA) INTEROPERABILITY UPDATE - DAVID SPENNER

- PUBLIC SAFETY ANSWERING POINT STANDARDS (PSAPS) WORKING GROUP
 - Group brainstormed group roles during first meeting
 - Dispatch center and operator credentialing is the main focus
 - PSAPS survey was sent out to every dispatch center
- MABAS / MARC REPEATER GRANT OPPORTUNITY
 - 42 applicants for either IFERN I / IFERN II base radios or automated MARC repeater identification circuitry
 - 17 were IFERN, 25 were MARC repeater ID
 - All eligible applicants received funding
- IN-BUILDING CODES
 - Following up on communication sent to the Department of Commerce regarding this
- FEMA REGION V RECWG
 - Federal legislation dictates that planning groups must be created

- FEMA is looking for locals, cross-discipline stakeholders, and statewide representatives
- The goal is to discuss planning in post-disaster situations / rebuilding
- Two FEMA / OEC staff will be present per region
- Brian Satula and Connie Caterall included in this working group
- OJA FORMAT TO CODIFY INTEROPERABILITY POLICIES
 - Proposed draft on policies to be sent out
 - Please forward any feedback to David Spenner
- COML LEADERSHIP COURSE
 - Envisioned for the third week of October in the Appleton / Oshkosh area
 - Issues of credentialing / selecting people
- TACTICAL INTEROPERABLE COMMUNICATIONS PLAN (TICP) WORKSHOP PILOT
 - TIC plan is more tactical / operational than strategic
 - A minimum of two county pilot workshops will be held this fall
 - There is some work that the counties will have to do for this
- PSIC Grant
 - Environmental impact study a special condition of funding
- Mutual Aid Frequency Coordinating Group (MAFCG)
 - Appointment letters for this working group to be mailed

URBAN AREA SECURITY INITIATIVE (UASI) INTEROPERABILITY UPDATE - KURT DREZEK

- UASI INTEROPERABILITY BACKGROUND
 - The spending plan from 2004 to 2008 has been determined using a risk-based formula, by an Executive board comprised of five county Emergency Managers, the Mayor of Milwaukee, and the Milwaukee Health, Police, and Fire departments
 - A mandate to spend 50% of funds on communications still exists
 - Fire departments are arguably the closest to interoperability
 - UASI's goals are aligned with the SCIP, in that all public safety agencies have access to mutual aid channels and that we reach the highest level of interoperable communications possible; we have made strides and are getting better at it by using CASM to identify our gaps
 - UASI is looking to link the 800 MHz system up to the state system
- RECENT ACTIVITIES
 - UASI monies funded the City of Milwaukee Digital Radio System, which is operational in five of eight districts
 - The system is being worked on for the Health and Fire departments
 - Waukesha county received an ACU-1000 (one of six ACU-1000s to be purchased recently)
 - One big project is the linking of MACOM with Milwaukee county's analog voice system
 - Squad-to-squad talkgroup created
 - Training and exercising are the big missing pieces right now; COML training is hoped to be a big part of UASI's future
 - Operational practices will be the big challenge across the state; you may see significant federal emphasis on this

- DEFERENCE
 - Report deferred to SSMG for further review

REPORT ON THE MUTUAL AID FREQUENCY COORDINATING GROUP (MAFCG) - TOM CZAJA

- APPOINTMENTS

- Seven of seventeen positions appointed
- Once members are assigned, an organization meeting will be held

SCIP PROGRESS REPORT REVIEW

- OVERVIEW
 - The document is a progress report, not a re-write of the SCIP
 - In the process of finalizing frequency agreements
 - There is no activity occurring at the state agency level regarding this (the understanding is that the applicable agencies have created agreements with Sprint and Nextel)
 - New section requires the identification of successes and challenges
- COMMENTS / QUESTIONS
 - Wisconsin is not far behind other states
 - It may even have been advantageous to not have been in the front, as we gain access to new technology and best practices
 - The right choice was made, despite a late start and some tough decisions
- PROPOSED ACTION
 - “The Interoperability Council moves to recommend submission of the Statewide Communications Interoperability Plan Progress Report.”

UPDATE ON THE AMERICAN RECOVERY AND REINVESTMENT ACT FUND ALLOCATION TO COMMUNICATIONS INTEROPERABILITY

- OVERVIEW
 - \$1,000,000 total funding
- PROPOSED ACTION
 - “The Interoperability Council moves to recommend OJA create grant opportunities for the following:
 - A demonstration project for a local community to migrate to using WISCOM for its daily Voice Communications Needs
 - Interface connections between local systems and WISCOM”
- MOTION
 - Motion made by Tom Czaja to pursue grant opportunities under both category A and B
 - Motion seconded by Sue Riseling for discussion
 - Discussion
 - Clarification made that motion is only defining categories
 - Clarification made that motion does not address timelines
 - Motion carries

HARMONIZING INTEROPERABLE COMMUNICATION OUTREACH ACTIVITIES - MARCIA KASIETA

- OVERVIEW
 - OJA has a suite of resources offered to help communities with interoperable communications through planning, training, technical assistance, etc
 - How WISCOM is integrated into that outreach and foster coordination with the IC and its sub-committees (Statewide System Management Group/SSMG, Statewide SCIP Implementation Group/SSIG (leaders of Regional Councils), Mutual Aid Frequency Coordinating Group/MAFCG) discussed

- The web page and other IC designs have been updated to create an IC brand
 - Main page is automatically refreshed from subordinate page content
 - Optimized to improve search engine hits
 - Tri-fold brochure that carries the IC branding used on web page
