OVERVIEW

- The new version of the Kimball Report was discussed in brief – no details
 - The report is near completion though changes to the report continue. Still looking at updates and would like to re-visit with recommendations regarding options to pursue in the near future.

TECHNICAL WORKGROUP REPORT – Carl Guse

OVERVIEW

- Discussion on Technical Workgroup member access to the system.
- Tony Barthuly has been active with radios on the system and sites are working well.
- Mike Knoll is actively working with the Minnesota and Wisconsin border counties. He summarized the work being done with interstate interoperability. Goodhue County is in the process of setting up VHF stations with Pierce County and WISCOM trunking capabilities. Mike is also conversing frequently with Dakota and Washington counties.
- **Carl Guse reviewed an implementation stage map.**
 - Map shows where specific sites are located
 - There are six sites that are currently on the air
 - There are fifty sites at the factory in Texas
 - After the fifty sites are shipped another twenty four will be built
 - Have identified a couple more possible sites for alternates
 - There are no impediments to the implementation plan
- Meeting with Minnesota last week
 - Discussed possibilities to put together ways of interstate interoperability
 - A gateway box could be utilized to interface WISCOM talkgroups into the MN ARMER system for border county interoperability.

OVERVIEW

- Concept Paper Project
 - Filing deadline was on October 1, 2010
 - Six groups were interested and have been approved. All are eligible for additional funding.
 - Taylor, Kewaunee, Douglas, Iowa, Dane, and Sawyer counties.
- MARC Repeater ID and Round 6 Radio Grants
 - Over one hundred pre-applications received to date for distribution of three million dollars
 - Will be working on the pre-applications over the next month
 - Guidance for Round 6 radio grants will be available next month at interop.wi.gov with grant announcement.

- Creation of a Membership Workgroup
